Main drivers for the financial markets today...

- **Stock markets down, government bond yields mixed with the 30-year UST printing losses, and the USD weakens. Concerns are growing about the long-term inflation outlook in the US following President Trump's bid to oust Fed Governor Lisa Cook**
- **Trump published a letter yesterday in which he argued that he has the authority to remove the official, doing so in the letter itself. However, Cook noted that the president does not have the authority to take such an action. The Supreme Court is expected to rule on this matter**
- **Staying on the monetary front, yesterday John Williams (New York) noted that he believes the neutral rate is not that different from the one that prevailed before the pandemic, suggesting that it remains low. Today we will be listening to comments from Barkin (Richmond)**
- **On the trade front, Trump threatened new tariffs and export controls on advanced semiconductors in response to countries imposing digital services taxes on US companies. Separately, the US outlined plans to raise tariffs on India to 50% as early as tomorrow**
- **In terms of economic data, US durable goods orders for July came in at -2.8% m/m, with those excluding transportation at 1.1%. House prices (June) and consumer confidence (August) will be released later. Meanwhile, in Brazil, inflation in the first half of August moderated to 4.95% y/y**
- **Assets in France came under pressure after Prime Minister François Bayrou called a vote of confidence to force the various parties to take a stance on the fiscal plan introduced by the government**

Equities

- Sentiment of aversion to risky assets leads to falls in the main stock indexes. In addition to political tensions in the US, Donald Trump is threatening to impose new tariffs and restrictions on the export of advanced technology and semiconductors
- In the US, futures anticipate a negative opening with the Nasdaq decreasing 0.2% below its theoretical value. In the same sense, Europe trades with losses due to a context of political uncertainty in the region and the Eurostoxx decreases 0.9%, dragged down by the fall in the energy and financial sectors. Asia closed mainly with declines
- For the S&P500 index, it was announced that Interactive Brokers will replace Walgreens Boots Alliance, effective before the opening on August 28. Eli Lilly & Co (+2.1%) rises after obtaining favorable results on an experimental anti-obesity pill

Sovereign fixed income, currencies and commodities

- The Treasuries' curve shows a steepening bias with gains at the short-end of 2bps and losses at the long-end of 2bps. Meanwhile, 10-year rates in Europe decrease by 3bps. Yesterday, the Mbonos closed the session with modest losses. The 10-year benchmark (Feb'36) closed at 9.05% (+3bps)
- The dollar falls against most developed currencies, with EUR (+0.3%) leading the gains. In emerging markets, performance is mixed with Asian currencies being the weakest, while European ones remain defensive. In Latin America, the MXN is among the few in positive territory, trading at 18.64 per dollar with an appreciation of 0.2%
- Crude-oil falls after a four-day streak of gains as investors await clearer signals on supplies. In metals, gold gains 0.3% and copper rises 0.2%

- Today, IDB Invest will offer a bank bond for up to MXN 2.5 billion with a three-year maturity. The issuance carries a Social Bond label
- Fitch Ratings affirmed Compañía Minera Autlán's rating at 'BBB+(mex)' while revising the outlook to Negative from Stable. The outlook change reflects heightened uncertainty and a business environment that has led Fitch to expect 2025 operating cash flow to fall short of prior projections
